



2.3 Wireless Hardware Setup

The SRG-3352C features both a SIM Card and Mini Card slot for connecting to wireless networks such as 4G. This section details how to install a SIM Card and 4G/LTE module on the mini card slot.

2.3.1 Mini Card Installation

Step 1. Remove the top cover by removing the 6 screws.



Step 2. Open the second antenna hole by removing the cover on the hole located on the left side.



Step 3. Install the RF coaxial cable in the antenna hole.



Step 4. Remove the bottom cover and install the 4G/LTE module in the Mini Card slot, and connect the coaxial cable to the 4G/LTE module.







Step 5. Place the bottom cover and secure with screws.



Step 6. Place the top cover and secure with screws.

2.3.2 SIM Card Installation

To install a SIM Card (Micro SIM) simply insert the SIM Card into the slot on the side of the system as shown. Take care to make sure the card is oriented correctly.



Chapter 3

Gateway Setup and Configuration

3.1 Connecting to System

When connecting a PC or laptop to the SRG-3352C system, it is recommended to use PuTTY with Windows 10. Users can download the software from the PuTTY website. https://www.putty.org/

For Windows 7 or older, users must first set up their PC to recognize the system. The following instructions detail how to set up your PC to connect to the SRG-3352C system by installing the CDC Serial Driver. The CDC Serial Driver can be downloaded from the SRG-3352C product page on AAEON.com.


- Step 1. Download the PuTTY tools software
- Step 2. Connect the gateway with USB cable

Connect your computer to the SRG-3352C using the micro USB port. Open **Device Manager** and locate **Multifunction Composite Gadget**. Double click on the device. A pop-up should appear, with a notice that the CDC Serial is unrecognized.



Step 3. Set the PuTTY configuration
